

Bibliography - Intermediate

1. Every source listed will begin first line at margin. For long citations, indent 2nd and 3rd lines.
2. Use italics for titles of books, periodicals and software. Titles of articles are enclosed in quotation marks.
3. Note punctuation and follow exactly.
4. If required information, such as author, is not available, ask for help.
5. Arrange all sources in one list, alphabetically by first word, which will generally be either the author's last name or the first word of the title.

Remember:

A = Author.

B = Book Title.

D = Date, Copyright.

F = Format (Print, Web, DVD/Video, Television).

PRINT SOURCES

Book with one author:

1. Author.
2. *Title of book.*
3. Date of publication.
4. Resource format.

Book with two authors:

1. Authors, in order they are listed on the title page.
2. *Title of book.*
3. Date of publication.
4. Resource format.

Ride, Sally and Tam O'Shaughnessy. *Exploring Our Solar System*. 2003. Print.

Encyclopedia and other familiar reference books:

1. Author of article (if available).
2. "Title of article."
3. *Title of book.*
4. Date of edition.
5. Resource format.

Hutson, James H. "Franklin, Benjamin." *The World Book Encyclopedia*. 2006. Print.

"France." *Compton's Encyclopedia*. 2004. Print.

Article in a periodical:

1. Author (if available).
2. "Title of article."
3. *Periodical name.*
4. Date.
5. Resource format.

Boelter, Mimi. "Voyage of Hope, Voyage of Tears." *Cobblestone*. Feb. 2006. Print.

"N.F.L. Training Camp Report." *The New York Times*. 21 Aug. 1996. Print.

4. Resource format.
5. Date you accessed website.
6. Full web address or article.
