Your Rights

Federal Program Citizen Complaint Procedures (Chapter 392-168 WAC)

These complaint procedures apply to federal programs authorized under the ESEA, including Title I, Part A: Improving Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged.

Anyone can file a complaint

A written complaint must be filed with the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) and must include:

1. A statement that the school district has violated a federal or state law or regulation that applies to a federal program.
2. A description of what happened and why it is a violation of federal law or regulation.
3. Name and address of the complainant.
4. Expected resolution.
5. Name and address of the school district that is alleged to have violated the law or regulation.
