

Woolley Wellness Center



Our mission is to meet the physical and mental health needs of the students in a nurturing environment that fosters the well-being of the Sedro-Woolley community, so students are safe, healthy and ready to learn.

What services does the Woolley Wellness Center offer?

Medical Services

- Physical exams, including general health, well child checks, sports and camp physicals.
- Treatment of minor and acute illness and injury, excluding the administration or dispensing of medications.
- Care of chronic conditions, often in coordination with community health care providers—long-term management of serious health conditions requires joint management.
- Referral and follow up for serious illnesses and emergencies, including linking with emergency services.
- Immunizations—immunizations are provided consistent with community practice using the Vaccine for Children Program.
- Laboratory testing—some lab work is done at each site or sent out to a contracted community lab.
- Pharmacy—pharmaceuticals are prescribed and either dispensed from the limited onsite dispensary or patient/family is referred to a community pharmacy. PeaceHealth Providers who can lawfully provide medication management may provide a student's

prescribed psychotropic medication and support students who have a prescription for these medications.

- Vision and hearing screening.
- Health promotion and illness prevention:
 - Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) exams;
 - Risk assessments;
 - Individual counseling for disease prevention/health maintenance;
 - Health education and promotion (including outreach-focused activities in the school);
 - Nutrition, fitness, and self-care skills;
 - Substance use/abuse education, including tobacco;
 - Sexual abuse, violence, and harassment prevention education;
 - Safety information;
 - Mental health screening and referral;
 - Stress reduction, supportive counseling;
 - Identification of developmental assets, risk and resiliency factors;
 - Harm reduction and coping skills support

Who can be seen at the center?

Any Sedro-Woolley High School or State Street School student may be seen at the wellness center. Parental consent is required for services, and consent forms are available at the Woolley Wellness Center or online at swsd.k12.wa.us - select Sedro-Woolley High School and navigate to the Wellness Center channel for more information.

What is the cost?

PeaceHealth Medical Group has partnered with Sedro-Woolley School District to provide medical services at the Woolley Wellness Center. Private insurance will be billed by PeaceHealth for provided services. All students will be seen regardless of whether or not they have insurance.

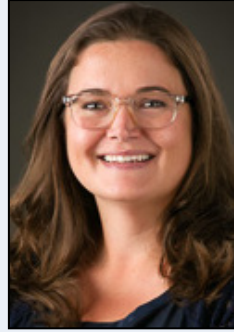
Hours
