Frequently Asksed Questions

Who can be seen at the center?

Any Sedro-Woolley High School or State Street School student may be seen at the wellness center. Parental consent is required for services, and consent forms are available at the Woolley Wellness Center or scan the QR Code.



What is the cost?

PeaceHealth Medical Group partnered with Sedro-Woolley School District to provide medical services at the Woolley Wellness Center. Private insurance will be billed by PeaceHealth for provided services. All students will be seen regardless of whether or not they have insurance.

Tuesdays - 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.
Thursdays - 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Location

The Woolley Wellness Center is located in the main hallway at Sedro-Woolley High School.

Appointments

Students can schedule appointments online through their individual PeaceHealth Portal, in-person, or by calling 360-856-8810.

Current PeaceHealth Patients

Current PeaceHealth patients' information will be easily available in the PeaceHealth patient portal system. If students are not a current patient (or if insurance information isn't up to date), please include current insurance information on the registration form. This paperwork will need to be updated annually and/or when insurance information becomes outdated.

What can the Woolley Wellness Center do for students?

The center is able to diagnose and treat many common conditions.

If a student accesses the Woolley Wellness Center, can they still visit the school nurse?

Yes! All students who visit the Woolley Wellness Center will still have access to services provided by the school nurse, regardless of their status with the Woolley Wellness Center.

Should a student get ill during the school day, the school nurse may coordinate care with the Woolley Wellness Center staff.

What if the student already has a doctor?

The Woolley Wellness Center does not replace a student's regular health-care provider, but rather they can supplement the services he/she provides.

If a student does not currently have a primary care provider, the Woolley Wellness Center staff will gladly connect students with one.

How does the school nurse and Woolley Wellness Center work together?

By working with the high school nurse, the Woolley Wellness Center enhances student health, academic outcomes, and overall well-being.

Together, they will screen for and treat barriers to learning, and decrease student absenteeism.

They both increase information sharing and protect student privacy and continuity of care.

Together, they plan and implement health promotion and disease prevention programs.
